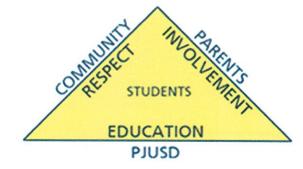

## Pierce USD High School Solar Carport Project



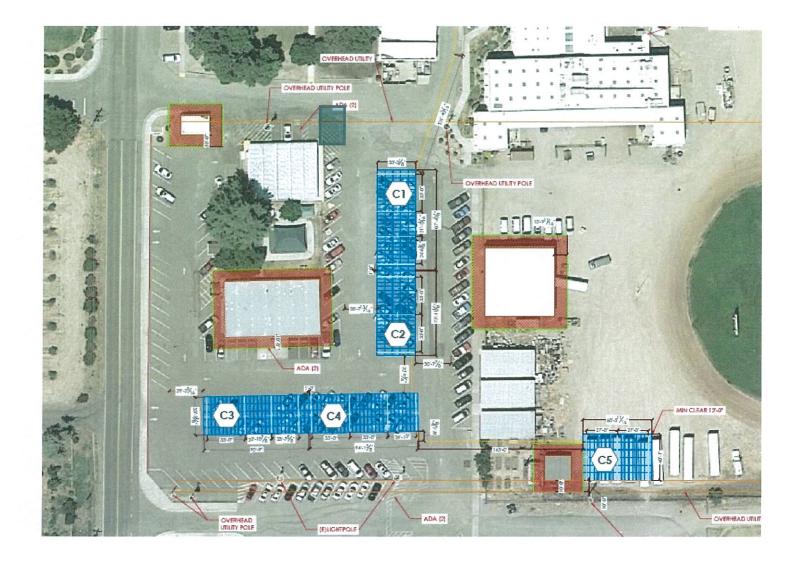

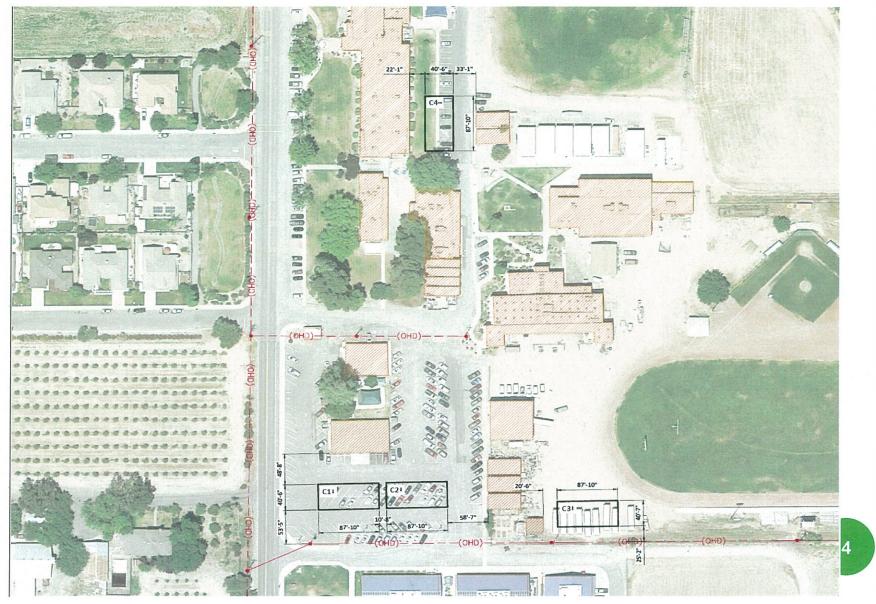


# Original High School Carport Solar Layout
